

FAUX STACK BRACELETS by Sara Lovcraft



Create the look of multiple bracelets in the convenience of one. Stack this fun multistrand bracelet with your other favorites or let this be the star arm candy this summer.

SUPPLIES:

- Black Round Leather
- B-Lon Tex 210 Nylon Cording
- Turquoise Dyed Howlite Heishi Beads, 8mm
- Brown and Black Striped Wood Round Beads, 6mm
- Button

TOOLS:

- Tying Station
- G-S Hypo Cement
- Scissors

- STEP 1: Cut 18 inches of black leather cord. Fold in half and create an overhand knot, leaving a loop that will slip around your button.
- STEP 2: Secure the leather to the Tying Station.
- STEP 3: Cut three 60 inch pieces of black B-Lon.
- STEP 4: Gather the three pieces and find the center. Place the center under the leather cord on the Tying Station.
- STEP 5: Create three square knots, securing the B-lon to the leather cord.
- STEP 6: Separate the six pieces of B-lon, three on the left and three on the right.
- STEP 7: With the three left pieces of B-Lon, add eight wooden beads to the center piece and secure the end to the bottom of the Tying Station.
- STEP 8: Using the two outer pieces to create five square knots.
- STEP 9: Slide a wooden bead up against the knots and create a square knot around the bead.
- STEP 10: Repeat this process, adding all eight beads with five square knots between each of them. End in five square knots.
- STEP 11: On the right side of the bracelet, add a howlite bead to each strand of B-Lon, bring the three pieces together and tie an over hand knot.
- STEP 12: Repeat this process, adding three beads and tying a knot between each group of beads until you have six bundles of three beads each.
- STEP 13: Bring the left and right ends of the B-Lon back together and create three square knots over the leather cords.
- STEP 14: Remove the bracelet from the Tying Station.
- STEP 15: Bring the ends of the B-Lon to the back of the bracelet and tie them in a knot up against the back of the square knots.
- STEP 16: Add G-S Hypo cement to the knot, and trim the ends.
- STEP 17: Tie and overhand knot with the leather ends.
- STEP 18: Thread a button onto one of the leather cords and slide it up against the knot. Tie another over hand knot to secure the button in place. Trim the ends.
